

Coal's Role in the regions

- The use of domestic coal deposits reduces import dependence, thereby increasing security of energy supply.
- Regional prosperity and employment are created; a 500 MW power station operating 7000 h/p.a. and selling electricity for 40 €/MWh anchors 3 bn. € in the region within 20 years. With indigenous coal, the added value remains in the region.
- The additional economic prosperity enables the regions to develop their economic structure without any disruptions, but with a long term vision.




<u>DZW</u> Lower Silesia Coal Basin <u>GZW</u> Upper Silesia Coal Basin




Poland - Hard Coal Production




Brown Coal Industry in Poland in 2005

- At the end of 2005 the employment in brown coal industry amounted to 20 148 persons.






Fuel Input for Power Generation in UK

Current challenges with regard to coal

- Access to Resources
 - No close down of mines based on short term considerations
 - The legal system must also in practice further allow reasonable planning permission delays for coal and lignite production
- Industry to continuously modernize coal-fired power plants, increase efficiency and to develop/deploy CCS; policy makers to help by delivering investment security
- The EU ETS as from 2013 Fuel specific benchmarks with load factors correspond to the objective of transfering the EU ETS to other industrialized and threshold countries
